Its menu highlights local flavors, including grilled meats, rice meals, and sauces commonly enjoyed in Filipino households. A visit to Mang Inasal allows students to experience a more traditional aspect of Filipino cuisine and dining culture, making it a meaningful and often anticipated inclusion in the tour itinerary.

Visitors can also explore the Parul Sampernandu Museum, which showcases the city's rich lantern-making heritage through exhibits, interactive displays, and traditional craftsmanship, offering a deeper appreciation of San Fernando's enduring title as the Lantern Capital of Pampanga.

Through this activity, participants gain a deeper appreciation of Pampanga's reputation as the "Culinary Capital of the Philippines" and develop a meaningful understanding of the region's food culture.

 - **Sto. Rosario Church**

Located in the heritage district of Angeles City, the Pamintuan Mansion and Santo Rosario Church stand as important landmarks reflecting the city's rich history and culture. The Pamintuan Mansion, now part of the Museum of Philippine Social History, showcases colonial architecture and served as the headquarters of General Emilio Aguinaldo during the first anniversary of Philippine Independence in 1899. Just nearby, the Santo Rosario Church—built in the late 19th century by Filipino laborers—remains a symbol of faith and resilience, known for its elegant Spanish-era design. Together, these sites offer visitors a meaningful glimpse into the city's storied past and enduring heritage.
